English

Writing:

- To spell words containing each of the phonemes already taught.
- Begin to form lowercase letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place.
- To say a sentence out loud before writing it.

Reading:

- Apply phonic knowledge and skills to decode words.
- Read common exception words.
- Listen to and talk about poems and stories.
- To show an understanding of what they have read.

Computing

- Internet safety.
- To log on and off a computer and chrome book.

Topic – Paws, Claws and Whiskers

Science:

- To identify and name a number of common animals.
- To name different parts of the body.
- To observe similarities and differences between different animals and to group animals in different categories.
- To identify and name a variety of different common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.
- To understand what animals need to survive and how to take care of them.
- To develop an awareness of different habitats that animals live in.
