

Half Term Curriculum Overview



Year 5 Summer 2 – 2020-21

English

Pupils will be reading *The Railway Children*, by E. Nesbit.

- Pupils will write a formal letter, use drama, develop settings and characters inspired by the text, and write an alternative ending to the story.
- Pupils will continue to develop their reading skills during Destination Reader sessions. We will be focusing on inference and deduction, evaluating text, retrieving implicit and explicit evidence from the text to support opinions/ answers/ predictions.
- SPAG – pupils will use cohesive devices (connecting adverbs and adverbials) to link ideas within paragraphs; using modal verbs or adverbs; using suffixes to change words; using a thesaurus; investigating root words; spelling words with silent letters; using parenthesis (brackets, dashes, commas).

Computing

- Pupils will continue to use the internet safely, including being critical of online content.
- Pupils will become familiar with blogs as a medium and genre of writing. They will create a sequence of blogs on a theme, and begin to incorporate additional media. They will comment on the posts of others, maintaining appropriate online etiquette.

Spanish

- Pupils will learn key vocabulary related to clothes.
- Pupils will learn the present tense of – ar verbs, reading longer passages and offer opinions about clothes.

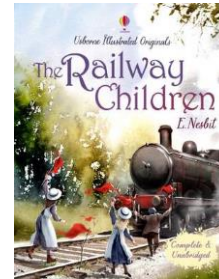
Topic – Southgate Times

Our topic this term looks at the history of Southgate – our local area.

- Pupils will learn about some of counties and cities of the UK.
- Pupils will explore the expansion of the London Underground, and how this impacted the development of Southgate.
- They will find out about significant historical figures who were associated with the local area, and learn about local landmarks.
- They will study maps, learning about scale, keys and topographic features.
- Pupils will use grid references to locate features and places on maps.

In **RE**, pupils will study Buddhism - Dharma day.

In **PSHE**, pupils will learn about living in the wider world. The focus will be on foreign currency, what influences spending and saving money.



Music

Pupils will listen to appraise a selection of classical pieces. They will also learn about the composition process of real musicians and composers. Pupils will use tuned and percussion instruments to create their own pieces.

Mathematics

- Pupils will continue to identify, describe and represent the position of a shape following a reflection or translation.
- Pupils will convert between different units of metric measure.
- They will understand and use approximate equivalences between metric units and common imperial units, such as inches, pounds and pints.
- Pupils will measure and calculate the perimeter of composite rectilinear shapes in centimetres and metres.
- They will calculate and compare the area of rectangles, and estimate the area of irregular shapes.
- Pupils will estimate volume and capacity.
- Pupils will solve problems involving converting between units of time.
- They will use all four operations to solve problems involving measure, e.g. length, mass, volume, money, using decimal notation, including scaling.

P.E.

- Pupils will learn about Athletics in the summer term.
- This is closely related to the skills they will demonstrate on sports day.
- Pupils will focus upon flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance. To use running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination.

Homework

- **Topic:** Projects based on Local History through a variety of media.
- **Spellings:** A test each week; new spellings given out each Friday.
- **Reading:** To be practised regularly. Books are changed when completed.
- **Mathematics:** Weekly Maths Homework.
