#### **RECEPTION CURRICULUM OVERVIEW Summer 1**

April 2021

Dear Parents/Carers,

We cannot believe how quickly the school year has flown by as your growing children enter the final term of Reception. Summer Term is such an exciting time of year as we watch the Reception children make their final leap of development and growth in confidence before they begin preparing for Year 1.





#### **Topics**

Next half term our topics will be 'Why is Water Wet?' and 'Growth and Change.'

The children will share their imaginative ideas on how to create our 'under the sea' role play area for their new topic 'Why is Water Wet?' As part of this topic the children will learn about information books and fact finding using the internet. They will make their own information book about animals that live under the sea. The children will also begin sharing their 'All About Me Boxes', your homework for the half term. The Teachers always enjoy seeing all the lovely baby photos and special objects that the children speak so animatedly about. We will keep the items in the boxes safe and they will be put on display. As part of the Growth and Change topic the children have lots of visitors coming including some live caterpillars and frog spawn. They will see the life cycle of these creatures first hand. We will also have a visit from a baby and their mummy.

#### **Phonics**

The children have been taught all of the phonemes in phase 2 and 3 of 'Letters and Sounds' and will continue to practice applying them. They will continue to learn to read and write the common and tricky words (words that can't be sounded out and need to be learnt by sight) and will continue to practice reading more complex words using the taught sounds. We will move onto the next phase of phonics, phase 5 which involves teaching further graphemes for reading and teaching and practising reading high-frequency (common) words, as well as reading and spelling two-syllable and three-syllable words. For example, they already know *ai* as in r*ai*n, but now they will be introduced to *ay* as in d*ay* and *a-e* as in make. Please enjoy sharing the carefully selected guided reading books to help develop your child's reading skills. It is very important that you let the teacher know how your child gets on with reading so that we can help support your child's home reading.

# Please could you check at home for any school reading books. Some books that children have chosen have not been returned.

Graphemes for reading	High Frequency (common) Words
Week 1 - ay, ou, ie	Common words for reading
Week 2 - ea, oy, ir, ue	oh, their, people, Mr, Mrs, looked, called, asked
Week 3 - aw, wh	Common words for spelling Said, so, have, like, some, come, were, there
Week 4 – ph, oe	
Week 5 – au, a_e, e_e	
Week 6 – Holidays (after half term - i_e, o_e, u_e)	

## Transition to Year 1

To support your child's transition into Year 1, we ask that when the children return to school after the school holidays, your child comes into the classroom by themselves from the main Reception gate. The class teachers will be at the gates as normal and the support staff will be in the cloakroom to support and help the children to hang their belongings. We have been practising this at school, so your little ones are expecting this small but important change in routine.

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LEARNING INTENTIONS	WAYS TO HELP AT HOME
Personal, Social and Emotional     Talk about how they and others show feelings, talk about their own and others' behaviour, and its consequences	Share story books and discuss how the characters felt and why.

In Southgate there are no beaches but we can go to the park where there is grass.</li> <li>Go on walks and observe how the natural world changes over time.</li> </ul>
Physical	Go to the park and do an obstacle course.
