



Half Term Curriculum Overview



Year 4 Autumn 2 – 2022-23

English

- Children will write engaging story openings, build ups and endings and learn how to convey a message through a story, all based on the rich narrative from the book 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane'. Children will compose sentences using a wider range of structures, including expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials. They will use ambitious vocabulary and informal writing to write postcards. They will explore features of newspaper articles and write their own, using figurative language and varying sentence structure.
- Children will also explore a range of myths, focusing on trickster tales such as 'Raven'. They will examine this topic from both a non-fiction perspective, writing a non-chronological report, and will also write their own narrative based on this genre. As part of this, they will focus on punctuating dialogue with inverted commas and using the present perfect tense.

Computing

Topic – Europe, Here We Come!

Europe, Here We Come!

Geography:

- To use atlases, maps, globes and digital mapping to locate countries in Europe.
- To explore key aspects of physical geography e.g. climate zones, mountains and rivers.
- Describe and understand key aspects of human geography, including: types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water.

D&T

Children will create castanets and investigate the most effective material.

ART

Children will produce art based on topographical maps.

RE

The focus this term is Buddhism: Kathina.

PSHE

This half term the children will be focussing on wellbeing and mental health. The children will be learning about change and loss and managing feelings of bereavement. The children will also be learning that managing mental health and wellbeing is part of everyday life.

Mathematics

Length and Perimeter

- In this unit, children will convert between different units of measure (such as km and m), including fraction conversions. Also, they will measure and calculate the perimeter of rectilinear shapes by counting squares, adding lengths and using knowledge of shape properties.

Multiplication and Division

- Recall multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables
- Multiply and divide mentally, including multiplying by 0 and 1 and dividing by 1.
- Recognise and use factor pairs and commutativity in mental calculations.
- Solve problems involving multiplying and adding, including using the distributive law, integer scaling problems and harder correspondence problems.
- Multiply two-digit and three-digit numbers by a one-digit number using formal written layout.

P.E.

- Gymnastics – Bridges (Mondays) & Games - Invasion Games (Thursday)

Spanish

- Recognise, recall and spell common animals in Spanish.
- Understand that articles /determiners have more options in Spanish than they do in English.

Music

In Year 4 the children will be learning to sing songs in unison and will be introduced to two-part vocal harmonies. They will be learning song for the Winter Concert from composers James Pierpont and Mariah Carey.
