Threads was launched by the creators of Facebook, Instagram and WhatsApp in July and has a similar concept as Twitter. Users can share text posts with photos and videos in response to create a thread. Users must be aged 13 and over and have an Instagram account.

Users aged 13 -17 will automatically have their accounts set to private when they join. They will then have the option to filter out words which may be offensive. Users are able to unfollow, block and report a profile. Any account which has been blocked from their instrangam will automatically be blocked on Threads as well.

Functions from Threads are still being developed and currently users are unable to private message each other.

Parents and carers are encouraged to talk to their child and manage their profile to ensure content is appropriate. Ensuring the child is aware of how to block and report inappropriate behaviour they may come across. The user should be made aware of their privacy and safety settings and ensure they know that they can always speak to a trusted adult.
