A warm welcome back to the summer term!

No doubt you will have seen or heard the exciting developments on the back field. We are creating a new all weather mini sports pitch that will replace the 'astro' in the front playground for lunchtime sessions and also still for PE. The stage, which is used by many children for creative movement at break times, has finally got a roof solution so that even on damp days the surface will be safe for the children to play on. It also doubles up as an outdoor classroom to support all our outdoor learning. The stage is already finished and we hope the pitch will be completed within the next couple of weeks. We have used PE premium, a government grant which schools get to improve physical activity beyond the PE curriculum, to fund these projects. 
