This week at Osidge it was all things Spanish – activities to complement our teaching of Spanish as our modern foreign language. Y5 had the opportunity on Thursday to explore the world of film making in a project using green screens. With video the main way in which young people consume content, this was a great opportunity for them to literally be behind the scenes!

Today the girls' football team took part in a Barnet-wide tournament themed around barriers to sport and international women's day. 25 Barnet schools participated: well done to Osidge for winning the tournament. With the women's Euros coming up soon, it was a chance for everyone to be inspired!

Healthy Habits - Teeth
